Call for applications for the 5th Nordic Diploma Course in Advanced Pain Medicine

The series of courses start the 8th of November 2010 in Uppsala, Sweden

The Scandinavian Society of Anaesthesiology and Intensive Care Medicine (SSAI) co-ordinates an Inter-Nordic post-specialist training programme in advanced pain medicine. The programme is limited to 25 younger trainees, predominantly anaesthesiologists but candidates from other specialities may be considered. The training period is 1½ - 2 years. During the training period, 5 courses each lasting 3 days will be arranged. The courses will circulate among the Nordic countries (Sweden, Finland, Denmark, Norway and Iceland). The courses will be held in English.

During the 2-years period clinical training of a minimum of 3 months should be carried out at a university multidisciplinary pain clinic or a multidisciplinary department of palliative medicine.

Furthermore, within the 2 years the trainee should complete a project or a written paper according to further instructions. Trainees completing the 2-year's Inter-Nordic training programme will receive a diploma in advanced pain medicine from the SSAI.

All expenses for the education (the fee for course which is DKK 6.000 (800 EUR), travel and accommodation) must be covered by the applicant's host department.

Application form approved and signed by the chairman of the host clinic including motivation and documented interest in pain medicine, a curriculum vitae (one original and two copies) and a statement of an appointment with a minimum of 3 months stay at a university multidisciplinary pain clinic or a department of palliative medicine, should be sent to the Secretariat no later than May the 29th 2010, labelled "Pain Education".
