This Course has been developed by experts from the Scandinavian Countries and the faculty consists of members from the group behind the BEST concept from Norway, Centre for Advanced Medical Simulation, Karolinska University Hospital, Arcada Medical Simulation Centre Finland and Danish Institute for Medical Simulation, Copenhagen.

Courses addressing the knowledge and skills necessary for the individual trauma team member are available in many institutions in the Scandinavian Countries. However, in order to function as an effective team, training the entire team in communication, leadership and cooperation is necessary. Simulation seems to be a valuable tool for this type of training. This requires facilitators, who can provide a safe environment, where learning can take place.

Course rationale

At this course we will focus on how to run simulation scenarios and how to debrief the

trauma team using structured, constructive feedback. This course will primarily focus on team skills.

Educational methods

The course is based on mini lectures, role-play and hands on training. The participants will practice the role as a facilitator in the full scale simulation based scenario and the debriefing session. The number of participants is limited to 20.



We expect the participants to possess the knowledge and skills necessary to function in the trauma team.
