

Preparation for the Personal Communication Course

Dear SSAI participant for the virtual session: Personal Communication

On the 22th of November 2021 we will meet **virtually** on Microsoft Teams from 5 PM to 7 PM CET, and we are looking forward to that. For the session we kindly ask you to prepare a **Pecha Kucha**.

Now, some of you might be wondering “*What is a Pecha Kucha?*”

Pecha Kucha, which means “the sound of conversation” in Japanese, was first conceived by Tokyo architects Astrid Klein and Mark Dytham, who were seeking a way to encourage student presenters to use PowerPoint in a more organized and succinct manner. It is a great structure to convey a message or a short presentation.

For your Pecha Kucha you will have **15 slides** to tell something about yourself to your colleagues (not 20 slides), and **20 seconds pr slide**. This gives you a 5 minute speak to share with the team you will be in.

The 5 minutes could contain answers to the following questions:

1. What characterizes me as a person?
2. What characterizes me as a leader?
3. What is my biggest passion?
4. In which situations am I a bad version of myself?
5. Find a difficult situation you have been in as a leader – which ended up being a deep learning experience.
6. What has been my biggest moment as an anesthesiologist? Something I am proud of.

To further explain how to “cook a great Pecha Kucha” presentation of yourself, we have found two short videos for you to get started.

Video number 1: is a 4.5 minute video explaining how to build a good Pecha Kucha story while exemplifying the format at the same time.

Video number 2: is a 4 minute guide on how to set up a Pecha Kucha in power point, using timings. (This is a great help when doing the actual presentation).

Please have your power points (w. timings) ready with you, when we meet virtually on the 22th of November.
